Emergency Management (EM) is an emerging high-intensity field that requires unwavering expertise and steadfast leadership. The MACEM delivers development and training opportunities for current emergency management professionals, and academic programs for aspiring learners who seek a solid foundation in EM knowledge.

The Department of Homeland Security (DHS) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) work to identify emergency management education and training needs. FEMA's Emergency Management Institute (EMI) delivers free online Independent Study (IS) courses to meet these needs.

The MACEM at Frederick Community College (FCC) recognizes successful completion of Independent Study courses and awards academic credit for coursework that meets FCC academic standards. Students may apply course credits toward academic credentials, and many courses satisfy employer professional development credit requirements.

FEMA Independent Study courses empower emergency management professionals to:

- Acquire critical, relevant information.
- Complete work online.
- Earn academic credits or a degree.
- Fulfill job credentials.
- Advance professional qualifications.

Converting FEMA Independent Study Courses to Academic Credit

1. Complete FEMA Independent Study program course(s) at training.fema.gov/is.
2. Order academic credit(s) and request official transcript(s) at em-study.com.
3. Receive an FCC transcript reflecting academic credit.

Important Student Notes

- Confirm selected courses are eligible for academic credit and/or meet desired student outcomes.
- Verify semester dates at frederick.edu/FEMA.
- Credit conversion cost is \$88 per credit.
- Academic credit is assigned a 'P' for passing. ('P' is equivalent to a grade of 'C' or better and does not factor into calculating a student's GPA.)
- Allow four weeks for processing—expedited service is not available.

Emergency Management Associate of Applied Science¹

These comprehensive 60-credit programs focus on preparedness and essential skills needed to organize and lead emergency management operations:

Track 1: Independent Study²

FEMA Independent Study curriculum serves as the foundation to deliver this online degree program.

Track 2: Residency Pathway²

A combination of online and on-campus courses offers regional students the option to earn a degree in a hybrid format at FCC.

Emergency Management Certificate¹

Providing a broad education in emergency management with a focus on preparedness and essential skills needed to organize and lead emergency management operations, the certificate incorporates FEMA Independent Study curriculum in a 26-credit online program.

Emergency Management Letters of Recognition¹

Delivering basic emergency management skills and experience pertinent to immediate entry-level employment in specialized fields, the letters of recognition incorporate specific FEMA Independent Study curriculum in condensed 6-8 credit online programs.

¹ Students are strongly encouraged to first contact the Emergency Management Program Manager, prior to enrolling and prior to each semester, to facilitate the process of carefully selecting and sequencing courses based on interests and educational requirements.

² Students must complete English and Mathematics requirements within the first 24 credits. One general education course must meet the cultural competence graduation requirement. CORE: General Education CORE is a foundation of higher education curriculum providing a coherent intellectual experience for all students. Emergency Management Outlook

Emergency Management professionals work to prepare plans and procedures for responding to natural disasters and other emergencies. These professionals also help lead the response during and after emergencies, often in coordination with public safety officials, elected officials, nonprofit organizations, and government agencies.

The emergency management profession is growing at an annual rate of 20 percent with an increasing number of emergency management directors needed to develop response plans to protect people and property while limiting the damage from emergencies and disasters. Currently, indications reveal academic expertise having a more significant impact in the emergency management workplace moving forward.
