✓ What can you do to make the most of your visit?

- Academic reading and writing processes take time and effort, so **PLAN TO VISIT THE CENTER AT LEAST A WEEK BEFORE YOUR PAPER/ASSIGNMENT IS DUE!**

 - textbook(s)
 - instructor's assignment guidelines
 - copies of your research materials (articles, websites)
 - notes, outlines, and early drafts you've written, though we can still help even if you haven't written ANYTHING yet!



✓ Remember . . .

- Tutors are trained to teach you how to improve your own writing, reading, and thinking skills; expect to be asked lots of questions to help you think about how to improve your work.
- Tutors will not proofread or edit your writing “for” you but will collaborate “with” you, like a coach, to help you improve your skills.
- Tutors will not suggest a grade for your work.
- You are always, always responsible for your own work. Visiting the Center is no guarantee that you will earn a particular grade or write a “perfect” paper.
- Expect to walk away from your session with more motivation, understanding, and confidence.
