The Nursing program at FCC is a selective admissions program. This pathway is for students who have been accepted into the FCC Nursing program only. Students who have not yet been accepted into the Nursing program should begin the Pre-Health Professions Pre-Nursing pathway and apply to the Nursing program after all selective admissions courses have been completed.
