

## FCC Curriculum Pathway

Curriculum Pathways at FCC provides full-time, first-time college students with a suggested guide for completing an Associate degree in two years (four semesters). Using the Curriculum Pathway along with the PeopleSoft Degree Plan empowers students to track their progress towards graduation.

The Emergency Management AAS Track II: Residency Pathway is a hybrid format designed to provide the option for regional students to complete their degree through a combination of online and on-campus courses. It is strongly recommended all students work with the Emergency Management Program Manager each semester to carefully select and sequence courses based on their specific interests and needs.
