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# **Social Sciences**

The A.A. in Social Sciences trains students to analyze and understand human society and social relationships and prepares them to transfer to a four-year college or university in social sciences disciplines. Training in the social sciences prepares students for a wide range of careers and leadership roles in business, non-profits, education, government, and social services.

## **The Program**

Students in the A.A. in social sciences program will study the various fields that compose the social sciences. Students are able to explore a wide array of social science disciplines to help them identify a specific field of interest before they transfer to a four-year college or university.

Faculty in the social sciences area emphasize the development of analytic and critical thinking, public speaking, quantitative and qualitative research, and writing while training students to understand complex human dynamics and social problems. These skills are invaluable and relevant in both the public and private sector.

Students who transfer to a bachelor's degree program in the social sciences will have taken courses that are likely to relate to their chosen four-year major. Disciplines within the social sciences include addictions, anthropology, economics, education, geography, history, human services, political science, psychology, and sociology.

# **Learning Outcomes**

- Students will demonstrate understanding of major findings and ideas in addictions, anthropology, economics, education, geography, history, human services, political science, psychology, or sociology.
- Students will effectively communicate the potential a social science discipline has for contributing to the growth and development of human culture through ancillary material (written, oral, visual, and/or all three modes combined).
- Students will demonstrate critical reading and analytical skills.
- Students will be prepared to enter transfer institutions in social science fields.
